Tori says: The Bailey and WZZA families are proud to announce that the Alabama Broadcasters Association inducted my father, Robert "Bob" Carl Bailey into the Alabama Radio Hall of Fame. My mom, nephew, nieces, along with the mayor of my dad's hometown of Leighton and his wife, and my dad's attorney and his daughter, traveled to Birmingham for the occasion. I told a few stories about his incredible accomplishments: first Black licensed radio owner in northwest Alabama, first Black person to serve on an Alabama Governor's cabinet, first Black policeman hired in Huntsville, Alabama, first Black police Chief in Triana, Alabama, and so much more. He was one of the only owners in Alabama with radio stations in multiple markets (the Shoals area and Selma). He accomplished quite a bit during his walk on earth. Seeing him finally receive some of the recognition meant a lot. Peace and love, Tori.
