Tori says: I think that Jimmy Hughes would have approved his home going service held at a church on the corner of Jimmy Hughes Street. Folks were invited to the next annual "Jimmy Hughes Day" by the mayor of Leighton, Alabama (hometown to both Jimmy and my father). At his wife's request, I shared memories of time spent with him, like when Jimmy and I made the road trip over to Mississippi to celebrate the expansion of Ruben Hughes' radio station, and how my Dad went on tour with him after "Steal Away" and "Neighbor Neighbor" were released. I put Rick Hall's wife Linda on the spot by adding her name to the program. She did great talking about some things Jimmy said and did. Spooner Oldham and his wife were there. (Spooner is responsible for familiar tunes on many hit songs including Aretha Franklin's "Never Loved A Man".) It was good to spend time with Jimmy's family and friends, including his son Jimmy Hughes III who was in kindergarten with me. For the most part, Jimmy preferred staying off the public's radar, but sometimes I'd talk him into making a public appearance or doing an interview. He was a really nice person. Tori
